# 2024 at Gloucester Public School – An insight, as we plan for 2024 from Mrs Wakefield

## **Explicit Instruction**



This year, our school was chosen to participate in professional learning about Explicit Instruction. Explicit Instruction is systematic, direct, engaging and success oriented and is guided by a strong body of evidence to promote achievement for all students.

Our job as educators is to maximise student academic growth and one of the best tools is Explicit Instruction. From 2024, Gloucester Public School (GPS) will begin our journey with our signature pedagogy being Explicit Instruction. Our teaching approach will involve transparent explanations, strategically guided student talk,

step-by-step guidance with gradual release of supports and spaced, interwoven retrieval practice. Students are also provided with many opportunities to apply critical and creative thinking following mastery learning. These strategies align with cognitive science and how the brain processes, stores, and retrieves information.

Our aim at GPS is to be a centre of educational excellence where every student is known, valued, and cared for. Our learning culture is shaped by our five school expectations and the NSW Department of Education Behaviour Code for Students. The expectations and code, influence all actions and decisions, not only in the classroom, but across the whole school community. As educators, we are driven by our belief that, through excellence in teaching and learning, every child can achieve their absolute best.

We look forward to sharing our journey with you in 2024 and many years to come.

## **PSSA Sport in 2024**



From 2024, our preferred choice for PSSA Sport will be Gala Days, rather than single sporting event days. Gala Days equate to one day out of the classroom with multiple games, instead of multiple days for singular games. School sport and carnivals will absolutely continue.

We value sport and sportsmanship, however, we are finding that students are spending too many days out of the classroom/school, with someone recently stating to me that 'Year 6 is like a Gap Year' with so many days out of the classroom. This was a good pause point and a good example for GPS staff. Our job is to prepare our students for high school and teach all the Stage 3 content before transitioning to Stage 4 content in Year 7. No matter what stage/class students are in, our first and most important job is to teach, maximise and ensure academic growth.

I have written to Manning Zone PSSA and requested that most sports where possible such as Netball, Touch Football, Soccer etc. be run as Gala Days, for the benefit of all. We will still offer Zone Trials and Zone/Hunter carnivals e.g., swimming, athletics, cross country. For team PSSA sports, GPS primary students will be provided with three choices from 2024. From these choices, we will establish teams and try outs. As a school we are placing a considered limit on the PSSA sport choices, to gain more time in the classroom and do what we do best, learn and teach.

We are very blessed in Gloucester, with multiple sporting opportunities after school and on the weekends. We urge you to take advantage of these wonderful sporting opportunities.

Our core business is teaching and learning and maximising our time in the classroom.




