



Gloucester Public School Uniform Policy

The wearing of our school uniform is encouraged and recommended at all times. We feel our school uniform:

- defines an identity for the school and within the Gloucester community;
- develops a sense of belonging and pride to our school and the Gloucester community;
- provides an opportunity to build school spirit; and
- promotes a sense of inclusiveness and enhances the health and safety of students when involved in school activities.

This policy has been prepared in consultation with students, staff and the P&C Association.

One of our school expectations is to: **Wear full school uniform with pride.**

Girls

Winter - Terms 2 and 3

School Tunic
Light blue blouse
Navy stockings - under tunic
Navy trousers (long pants)
School shirt - (preferably long sleeved)
Navy tracksuit pants (no motifs)
Navy skort (not netball skirt or bike pants)
School jacket/jumper
Navy socks (white/navy socks on Fridays)
Plain joggers on Fridays only for sport
Black school shoes (no coloured laces or motifs)
School hat - everyday (No Hat, No Play)
Shy blue skivvy or undershirt on cold days under the school shirt for girls and boys

Summer - Terms 1 and 4

School dress
School shirt
Navy skort (not netball skirt or bike pants)
Navy shorts (no bike pants)
Navy socks (white/navy socks on Friday for sport)
Black school shoes (no motifs or coloured laces)
School hat - everyday (No Hat, No Play)
Plain joggers on Fridays for sport

Boys

School shirt - (preferably long sleeved)
Navy Trousers (long pants)
Navy Shorts
Navy tracksuit pants (no motifs)
School jacket/jumper
Navy socks (white/navy socks on Fridays)
Black school shoes (no motifs or coloured laces)
Plain joggers on Fridays for sport
School hat - everyday (No Hat, No Play)

School Shirt
Navy shorts (no motifs, plain navy)
Navy socks (white/navy socks on Friday for sport)
Black school shoes (no motifs or coloured laces)
School hat - everyday (No Hat, No Play)
Plain joggers on Fridays for sport

School Hat - School hats are compulsory whenever students are outside/outdoors. All students need to wear the school bucket hat. When enrolling, the first school bucket hat is free.

Make Up and Nail Polish - No make up and only clear nail polish should be worn to school. Nails should be kept at a length that will not cause injury to others. Some activities may require students to cut their nails.

Hair - Hair should be kept clean and tidy. Natural hair colouring is acceptable providing a combination of two or more colours is not used. Non-natural hair colouring is not acceptable e.g. green, pink, blue etc. or streaking using colours. Non-permanent hair colouring may be permitted on special occasions e.g. school discos. Hairstyles such as mohawk styles or 'extreme styles' are not acceptable. Hair accessories/ornaments in colours other than navy, gold/yellow and sky blue (school colours) are not acceptable.

Tattoos - Temporary Tattoos should be covered at all times and are not encouraged.

Body Piercing and Jewellery

No body piercings other than a maximum of two studs or sleepers per ear is acceptable. Studs and sleepers may need to be removed in order to participate in some sporting activities. Safety requirements dictate that bangles, bracelets, earrings (other than studs or sleepers), necklaces, rings etc. are not permitted to be worn at school. Students may be requested to remove jewellery that is not acceptable. Students will be asked to place the items in their bag to take home at the end of the school day.

Acceptable Jewellery -

- Medical alert bracelet or necklace - please discuss with the Principal
- A significantly religious necklace - please discuss with the Principal
- Culturally significant necklace or bracelet - please discuss with the Principal
- Personally significant necklace or bracelet - please discuss with the Principal
- Watch - used to tell the time
- Rubber Cause Bracelets - only worn for the day of the cause e.g. brain cancer
